Europe's Leaders in Anti-Semitism

In a survey performed by the “European Forum” of Hebrew University in advance of International Holocaust Remembrance Day, France and Poland were described as Europe’s most anti-Semitic countries from the perspective of Israeli respondents to the survey. The study found that France was viewed as most anti-Semitic by 39 percent of people, followed by Poland at 33 percent and Germany with 15 percent.
